Members created the vision through consultation.</p>

Does it or could it promote good relationships within and between communities? How will it help to prevent social exclusion? Will it help to reintegrate those who have become excluded? How will it provide good quality, inclusive services?</p> <p>The Washlands themselves are accessible – but getting to them from the adjacent residential areas or from the adjacent car parks needs improvement. Better and safer access at all times of the year would support sections of the community with mobility issues or with pushchairs.</p> <p>Better maintenance will improve the perception that the Washlands is unsafe due to the overgrown nature of the trees. Vulnerable people on their own are currently less likely to use the Washlands. The Strategy will aim to create a new maintenance plan which it is hoped will provide paths and walkways that feel safe.</p>
