Resolved:

The Chairman stated that the purpose of the hearing had been to consider Staffordshire Police's objections to a Temporary Event Notice given by Mrs Pam Kaur in respect of an event to be held at the Locomotive Sports Bar from 2.00am until 4.00am on Saturday 24th February 2018.

The Chairman began with the general comment that he and the other members of the sub-committee were long standing members of the Council and of the Licensing Committee, but none of them could recall witnessing such a lack of preparation on the part of one of the parties to the proceedings. The sub-committee had found it startling that Staffordshire Police did not particularise their objections at the outset, choosing instead to adopt a broad brush approach, whereby they alluded in the most general terms to concerns that allowing the event to proceed would undermine three of the Licensing Objectives (namely crime and disorder; public safety; and public nuisance).

In the lack of any submissions on the point and in the absence of any supporting evidence, the sub-committee had been provided with nothing to persuade them that allowing the proposed event to go ahead would undermine any of those licensing objectives and for that reason the sub-committee did not issue a counter notice.
