Re: Application for sale of alcohol - Cellar Door at Craythorne Farm DE13 0AZ TM ref: 225918346-01

We are writing re: the above application and also querying if there is to be any application for the playing of live or recorded music.

As with the Sloans Kitchen application there is a very broad timescale of 09.00 to 23.30 seven days a week with a longer time for New Years Eve.

Crime and Disorder

09.00 to 23.30 seven days a week with extra time for New Year's Eve is likely to contribute towards drunken behaviour and disorder upon leaving the premises. This will undoubtedly create friction with the local residents, who may be concerned about strangers trespassing and causing possible damage to their properties.

Public Safety

There is no footpath along the length of Craythorne Road and the access/egress to the site is rather tight. Drivers attempting to park or manoeuvre along this dark and narrow country lane could prove dangerous for any pedestrians. Any driver choosing not to use the car park may even decide to park on the frontages and grass verges of nearby properties. This would cause friction and compromise the safety of residents should they dare to challenge anyone who may be in an inebriated state.

Dependent upon the type of event being held it is possible that disorder may take place. Local residents will be concerned for their safety and welfare through any antisocial behaviour. This could also apply to Crime and Disorder and Public Nuisance.

Public Nuisance

The long licensing hours will mean that <u>any</u> time of <u>any</u> day the local residents could be disturbed with loud, rowdy behaviour, over which they will have no control or influence. We are fortunate to live in a peaceful country lane and do not consider it unreasonable that we should continue to appreciate the need and entitlement to quiet enjoyment of our homes.

There could be disruption and noise if taxi drivers choose to sit outside with engines running and lights on. As we are all aware a taxi driver rarely gets out of the car now to let their passengers know they are there and are likely sound their horn.

Noise and light pollution would be an obvious nuisance.

There has been no mention of music or entertainment, which we assume will be played. Our, very reasonable, concern is that recorded or live music has the potential to create a public nuisance; open doors in the summertime, music played outside, live entertainment of any description, doors being opened at all times of the year to allow for smoking outside.

If bright lighting is required outside then this could also become a public nuisance.

The business website looks very inviting. We are aware that it is only a small building and it advertises as a cosy courtyard cafe, which is ideal for the location. However, it has no details within the Events tab so it is nigh on impossible to understand what is intended. It would be a great help to understand the nature and frequency of proposed events to allay residents fears.

Perhaps the proprietors could make a point of mentioning (or preferably give a pre printed leaflet) to bookees of future events that, in consideration of the local residents, they are requested to leave the premises in a quiet and orderly fashion and to use the car park provided for any taxi drop off or collection.

Finally, if all the above concerns are addressed appropriately then Cellar Door may prove to be an absolute asset to our local area. We will be very happy to welcome them to the locality if they are able to allay our fears.
