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| 1007/19 | To apply to the 'Rapid Rehousing Pathway: 2019 to 2020' funding to secure revenue to supplement Rough Sleeper Outreach Service with a dedicated 'Navigator' service which will help rough sleepers with a high level of need overcome the barriers to accessing accommodation, particularly supported accommodation. This service will be linked to a supported accommodation provider and have privileged access to bed spaces on the strength of providing a further 3 months of support to a rough sleeper on their caseload once that person is in the supported accommodation. This will supplement the existing support offering of the accommodation provider and facilitate the acceptance of a higher presenting level of individual need. Grafton (UK) Limited has chosen as the provider to expand the Council's Empty Homes Service following a competitive tender exercise, with Grafton (UK) Limited being the only organisation to submit a tender. Through the development of this project, the council has worked with the TTTV and various partners in order to support a bid for Heritage Lottery Funding (HLF). In support of that bid, the Council agree to be a delivery partner for the overall project. In December 2018, the HLF funding was confirmed and embargoed for two months. However, unforeseen conditionality has been applied to the successful bid which changes the financial implications. The document creating conditionality is at Appendix A, and the original EDR is at Appendix B. | At the count in 2018 11 rough sleepers were identified, some of whom have become entrenched. If we accept the terms of the agreement at Appendix A, this investment from central government would drive solutions specifically for the entrenched cohort to markedly reduce the number of rough sleepers. | No | No | 25/06/2019 |
| 026/19 | To approve the programme for joint working with Highways England to address cleanliness levels on A38. | <p>The A38 forms part of the nation's strategic road network as, as such, is maintained by Highways England (HE). However, as Principal Litter Authority, the Council retains responsibility for litter picking. It is a major route through the borough used by a high volume of traffic and, as such, accumulations of litter can have a significant impact.</p> <p>Whilst the Council has established direct links with key personnel at HE to establish a strategy for undertaking litter picking, it must also work with Kier Highways, HE's appointed contractor. This has proven to be more difficult, despite the significant effort by the Council to formulate a 'partnership'. Whilst the Council has previously undertaken such work and has risk assessments and safe working procedures in place, Kier has made numerous requests for additional information, including:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> * All employees to have passed a safety critical worker medical; * Construction Skills Certificate Scheme (CSCS) card; * Risk Assessment Method Statement; * Vehicle risk assessments and LOLER certificates; * Evidence of staff training and competence; * Welfare facilities and emergency contact numbers. <p>All these documents and supporting information have been provided to Kier.</p> <p>A38 is a high speed trunk road and for health and safety reasons, it is not possible to collect litter along key stretches of the carriageway unless the workforce is protected by a lane or road closure. The intention is that the Council carry out their street cleaning activities during periods when Kier has a closure in place to undertake their own maintenance obligations. This is generally performed during the night to minimise impact on the travelling public.</p> <p>There is a window of opportunity in June, with a closure on the northbound carriageway between Branston and the A50 interchange. The Council is mobilising a crew to work on these dates.</p> <p>In addition, the Council has requested further dates when closures have been programmed with a view to undertaking further litter picking and will continue to liaise with HE and Kier in this regard. It is therefore proposed that contact be made on a quarterly basis to ensure that an up to date maintenance schedule is maintained and so the Council can programme its resources/activities.</p> | No | No | 19/06/2019 |
