

DECISION STATEMENT

NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN PROCEEDING TO REFERENDUM

1. Branston Neighbourhood Development Plan

1.1 I confirm that the Branston Neighbourhood Plan, as revised according to the modifications set out below, complies with the legal requirements and basic conditions set out in the Localism Act 2011, and with the provision made by or under sections 38A and 38B of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004. The Plan can therefore proceed to referendum. The referendum will be held on 23rd July 2015.

1.2 I also declare that I have no personal or prejudicial interest in respect of this decision.

2. Background

2.1 On 25th June 2012 Parish Council requested that, in accordance with section 5(1) of the Neighbourhood Planning (General) Regulations 2012 ("the Regulations"), their parish area be designated as a neighbourhood area, for which a Neighbourhood Plan will be prepared.

2.2 The Council confirms that for the purposes of section 5 (1) of the Regulations the Parish Council is the "relevant body" for their area.

2.3 In accordance with section 6 of the Regulations, East Staffordshire Borough Council placed on their website these applications, including parish boundary maps, details of where representations could be sent, and by what date, for a six week period 10th October to November 21st 2012. In addition, it publicised the application by issuing a press release, although maps and individual letters did not appear with this. Similarly, the relevant

application, together with details of where representations could be sent, and by what date, were advertised within the appropriate parish via the Parish Councils.

2.4 The Borough Council designated the Parish Council by way of Executive Decision of the appropriate Deputy Leader on 29th November 2012.

2.5 In accordance with Regulation 7, the decision to designate the Parish Council was advertised on the Council website together with the name, area covered and map of the area.

2.6 The Parish Council consulted on a pre-submission version of their draft Neighbourhood Plan between 16th June and 28th July 2014 fulfilling all the obligations set out in Regulation 14.

2.7 The Parish Council submitted their Neighbourhood Plan to East Staffordshire Borough Council on February 2nd 2015 in accordance with Regulation 15.

2.8 The Borough Council publicised the submitted Plan and its supporting documents for 6 weeks between February 9th and March 23rd 2015 in accordance with Regulation 16.

2.9 Mr. Terry Heselton was appointed to examine the Plan, and the Examination took place between 25th March and 4th May 2015.

2.10 The Examiner concluded he was satisfied that the Neighbourhood Plan was capable of meeting the legal requirements set out in the Localism Act 2011, including meeting the basic conditions, subject to the modifications set out in his report, set out below.

2.11 Schedule 4B s.12 to the Town and Country Planning Act 1990, as inserted by the Localism Act 2011, requires that a local authority must consider each of the recommendations made in the Examiner's report and decide what action to take in response to each recommendation. If the authority is satisfied that, subject to the modifications made, the draft Neighbourhood Plan meets the legal requirements and Basic Conditions as set out in legislation, a referendum must be held on the making of the Plan by the Borough Council. (If the local authority is not satisfied that the plan meets the basic conditions and legal requirements then it must refuse the proposal.) A referendum must take place and a majority of residents must vote in favour of the Neighbourhood Plan (50% plus one vote) before it can be 'made'.

2.12 The Basic Conditions are:

1. Has regard to national policy and guidance from Secretary of State
2. Contributes to sustainable development
3. Is in general conformity with the strategic policy of the development plan for the area or any part of that area

4. Does not breach or is otherwise compatible with EU obligations – this includes the SEA Directive of 2001/42/EC
5. The making of the Neighbourhood Plan is not likely to have a significant effect on a European site (as defined in the Conservation of Habitats and Species regulations 2010(d) or a European offshore marine site (as defined in the Offshore Marine Conservation (Natural Habitats &c) Regulations 2007 section 9(e) (either alone or in combination with other plans or projects).

ANNEXE 1 – New Table 1 (TO BE RE-NUMBERED TABLE 2 IN THE PLAN)

Sites Put Forward as Possible Local Green Spaces	Special Qualities and Local Character (All sites meet the Local Green Space criterion of being located in close proximity to the local community, since they are all within the built up area.)
1. Branston Golf Course	This is extensively used by the public for recreation. It is too large to meet the criteria for Local Green Spaces in the National Planning Policy Framework, but it is covered by policies protecting sports and open spaces in the 2006 and draft 2015 Local Plans.
2. Branston Cricket Club	This is a well-used leisure facility used by local residents and visitors to the Parish. It s covered by policies protecting sports and open spaces in the 2006 and draft 2015 Local Plans.
3. Regatta Allotments	These are statutory allotments and are key to the provision of local food production opportunities for local residents. As such, they are protected by statute, as well as by 2006 and draft 2015 Local Plan policies.
4. Toadhole	This provides a green wooded thoroughfare to the River Trent.
5. Clays Lane Park	This hosts a variety of sports for residents and is well-used by the local community and visitors
6. Beans Covert	This woodland is enjoyed by local residents for regular walking
7. Land near to Howards Transport	Last remaining area of green space in an area that has considerable housing development surrounding it. However, the principle of developing this site has been established, as permission for housing on the whole site has previously been granted. The permission has lapsed, but a new application has been submitted.
8. Regents Park open space	This area has considerable housing development surrounding it.

3.2 The Council concurs with the view of the Examiner that:

- subject to the modifications above, the Plan meets the Basic Conditions set out in para. 2.12 above; and that
- the referendum area should be coterminous with the neighbourhood area.
