


## Q4 Do you support Project C: our proposal for the development of a new Regional Learning Centre for the University of Wolverhampton in the heart of Burton Town Centre?

84	<p>Wolverhampton university already operate 2 regional learning centres at Telford and Stafford. In Stafford they occupied part of the county councils Staffordshire place office development which had remained empty for some time. Another part of the Staffordshire place development was eventually filled by the county council moving Stafford library to the empty units in their Staffordshire place development. I am quite certain that using Burtons town fund allocation towards similar moving of council services to other council owned sites will not be considered by those who will check the validity of the schemes to be what was encompassed in the town fund guidance or what the government envisage money being used for. I can only imagine that the initial brainstorming meeting when ideas for interventions were being put forward were mainly attended by borough and county council nominees. We already have a purpose built university centre at the Burton and South Derbyshire college and there is land available to extend this facility to provide additional accommodation for Wolverhampton university to run its courses. Students would then have all the ancillary facilities such as library, refreshments etc already to hand. The current plan is to close the towns brewhouse arts centre ( which building i think was given to the local authority by Bass specifically for conversion into an Arts centre] and to put Wolverhampton university into the building. How would such a move be viewed as enhancing the town or regenerating the area and levelling it up with the towns in the south east? The closure of the brewhouse would diminish the town and make it a much less attractive place to live and work in, exactly opposite to the over arching aims of the town fund scheme. This appears to be no less than another attempt by the councils to fill council owned assets and reduce council overheads. It is a total travesty and drives a coach and horses through the advertised aims of the town fund. I am aware that councils are severely cash strapped after years of cuts and austerity, but to propose using this once in a lifetime windfall of £25 m to further cut facilities and services is a real kick in the teeth. Hopefully any such proposal will be rejected at the stage when the Government checks the proposals against the guidance. I am bitterly disappointed that the councils should attempt to cover up this closure of much loved facilities and services under the cover of providing a building for university level education and providing a centralised hub for council services. I would approve of monies being used to allow for Wolverhampton uni opening a regional centre in Burton, but most definately NOT AT THE EXPENSE OF LOSING THE BREWHOUSE ARTS CENTRE. Can i suggest that one of the grade ii listed brewery buildings recently vacated at the "new brewery" in station street be converted for Wolverhampton University. This together with the nearby Brewhouse ARTS CENTRE could form the basis of a new " old brewery quarter" with match funding from the developers of the surrounding residential/mixed development.
