ENFORCEMENT NOTICE – OPERATIONAL DEVELOPMENT

To:

Issued by: East Staffordshire Borough Council, The Maltsters, Wetmore Road, Burton upon Trent, Staffordshire DE14 1LS (“the Council”)

1. **This is a formal notice** which is issued by the Council, because it appears to it that there has been a breach of planning control, within paragraph (a) of section 171A(1) of the above Act, at the land described below. It considers that it is expedient to issue this notice, having regard to the provisions of the development plan and to other material planning considerations. The Annex at the end of this notice contains important additional information.

2. **The land to which this notice relates**

The land at “Ash Tree House”, Ashbrook Lane, Abbots Bromley, Staffordshire, WS15 3DN, shown edged in red on the attached plan (“the Land”).

3. **The matters which appear to constitute the breach of planning control**

Without planning permission, the unauthorised siting of a shipping style, metal storage container on the Land in the position shown hatched in black on the attached plan.

4. **Reasons for issuing this notice**

The Council considers it expedient to issue this notice for the following reasons:

- (1) It appears to the Council that the above breach of planning control has occurred within the last four years.
- (2) The shipping style, metal storage container is positioned to the front of Ash Tree House which is situated within a Conservation Area. Its position means that it is clearly visible from the adjacent highway and is detrimental to the amenity of the street scene. The container does not relate well to the existing properties by way of scale, massing and materials of construction.
- (3) The shipping style, metal storage container fails to preserve the character or appearance of the Conservation Area contrary to Section 12 of the National Planning Policy Framework.
- (4) The Council does not consider that planning permission should be given, because planning conditions could not overcome these objections.

5. **What you are required to do**

- (1) Remove the shipping style, metal storage container from the front of the Land.

- (2) Remove from the front of the Land all the building materials and rubble arising from compliance with requirement (1) above, and restore the Land to its former condition before the breach took place.


6. Time for compliance

21 days beginning with the day on which this notice takes effect.

7. When this notice takes effect

This notice takes effect on 14th March 2016 unless an appeal is made against it beforehand.

You MUST make sure that we receive your appeal before the effective date on the enforcement notice.

In exceptional circumstances you may give notice of appeal by fax or letter. You should include:-

- The name of the local planning authority;
- The site address;
- Your address; and
- The effective date of the enforcement notice.

We **MUST** receive this before the effective date on the enforcement notice. This should **immediately** be followed by your completed appeal forms.
