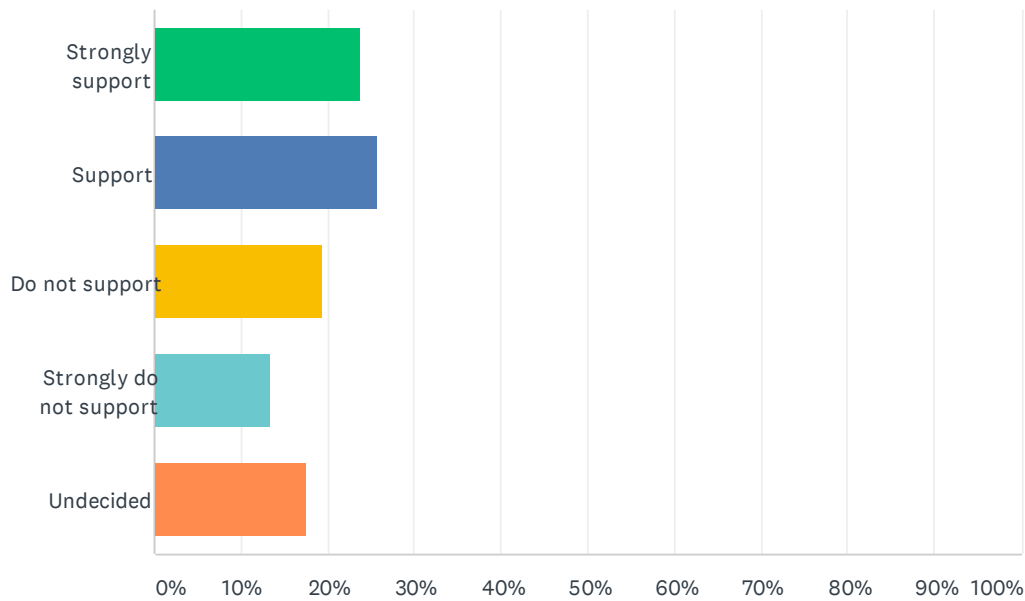


Q3 Do you support Project B: our proposal to repair and renovate the Grade II* listed Sinai Park House as a hospitality venue?
